

We've declared 2023 as Queensland's Year of Accessible Tourism to lead the State's transformation as the world's all-abilities destination of choice.

To ignite change and generate opportunity, the Queensland Government is backing this year's Accessible and Inclusive Tourism Conference in the Asia-Pacific on the Gold Coast.

This is a wonderful opportunity to connect with global experts on fast-tracking accessible infrastructure, game-changing technology and business learning.

Better visitor experience accessibility is a key initiative of Queensland's industry led Towards Tourism 2032 roadmap.

It's also part of our commitment to making the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games the most accessible and inclusive sporting event in world history.

The Queensland Government is investing \$12 million in the Year of Accessible Tourism to help tourism operators upgrade visitor infrastructure, supportive technology and business knowhow to transform our visitor economy.


